

FEE POLICY

The school fees and other charges are payable in four installments:

Last Date for payment

1 st	Installment	April-June	15 th April 202!
2^{nd}	Installment	July-Sept	15 th July 2025
3^{rd}	Installment	Oct-Dec	15 th Oct 2025
4^{th}	Installment	Jan-March	15 th Jan 2026

If the 15th of the month specified above is a holiday, the last date will be the preceding day and not the following day.

Sending the child in the new session will be deemed acceptance of the school fee and other charges as notified for 2025-26 by the school, on the school website.

Fee Rules:

- 1. Fees should be paid latest by the 15th of the first month of every quarter, otherwise a late fee charge of Rs. 50/- per day will be levied.
- 2. The parents who wish to continue their child in the school, kindly ensure that the first quarter fee is processed latest by 15th April of the current year.
- 3. Fee for after School hours activities will be payable additionally.
- 4. If a parent wishes to withdraw his ward from the school after taking the admission, a one month's notice in writing is required to obtain the Transfer Certificate. Admission fee is not refundable.
- 5. School Transport service will be available only on regular and timely payment of transport charges along with the school fee.
- 6. Parents can avail 7% discount on yearly fees by making payment for the whole year before 15th April 2025.
- 7. Please ensure that fee is paid on time to avoid any inconvenience. Constant reminders do not give us any pleasure.
- 8. Post dated cheque will not be accepted.
- 9. The name, class, section, admission no. of the student and parents mobile no. should be mentioned at the back of the cheque.
- 10. Parents can also make online payment of fee of their ward using the paytm or NEFT.
- 11. Fee slip is an important document which must be kept safely by the parent.
- 12. The name of the fee defaulter for two months will be struck off the rolls. A sum of Rs. 5000/- will be charged if re-admission is granted and too will be possible only after all the previous dues are cleared by DD only.
- 13. If any cheque is dishonored due to any reason, late fee plus Rs. 600/- will be charged as service charges.

Important: Kindly note that fee should be paid in time and the late fee charges levied will not be reduced or waived off.

ADMISSION / WITHDRAWAL / ABSENCE RULES

- Admission to Pre-Nursery and Nursery opens from March onwards. The children should be in the age group of 3+ for Nursery, 4+ for L.K.G and 5+ for UKG as on 1st April of the session in which admission is sought.
- The children from the neighborhood area are given preference.
- Prospectus/Application forms for admission to nursery are available on payment of Rs. 1100/-only from the school office on any working day between 9:30 a.m to 2:00 pm for a specified period. Application form should be submitted back by the due date along with registration fee of Rs. 1100/- (Non refundable).
- Tests for admission to other classes are held.
- No students above the age of 15 years (for class IX) will be admitted to the school.
- Students who are under transfer from schools outside U.P must have their transfer certificate counter-signed by the Inspector of schools of the state concerned.
- If a child has to be withdrawn from school, parents are requested to give one month's notice in writing, failing which one month's fee will be charged in lieu thereof.
- Those who leave the school in the middle have to pay for the whole Quarter. For example: those who leave school in March/April must in all cases pay the fee for the months May and June also. Transfer Certificate is issued only when all the dues of the school are settled.
- Transfer Certificates are not issued unless all dues of the school are settled.
- All the students, returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, should produce a fitness certificate from a doctor.

a) Chickenpox Till the scabs fall completely
 b) Cholera Till the child is completely well
 c) Measles Two weeks after the rash disappears
 d) Mumps Until the swelling has subsided

e) Whooping cough Six weeks.

- Absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than 15 consecutive days. Renders the student liable to have her /his name struck off the rolls. Fine of Rs. 5000 have to be paid as readmission charges.
- It is compulsory for the students to complete 80% of the attendance in the academic session to make them eligible to sit for final examination.

SCHOOL TRANSPORT RULES

BUS RULES

- 1. It will be the responsibility of the parents to ensure that their children reach the designated stop well on time. Transport will not be delayed if the child is unavailable at the pickup point.
- 2. Parents must ensure that they pick up their children at the notified time from the specified bus stop, failing which, the child will be taken back to the school and parents will need to come and collect their ward. In such case, only parents can pick up their child from the school. Any other person has to be properly authorized by parents. Also, the bus staff will not drop the students till class 5th without their guardian/ authorized person without consent form.
- 3. If the transport fee is not paid by the final date of fee payment then the child will not be allowed to use the facility.
- 4. School buses are arranged with the utmost care but school takes no responsibility for any mishap or delay due to situations not in control of the school authority.
- 5. A child should travel only on the route allotted and no other route.
- 6. Unruly behavior like shouting and bullying in the bus is strictly prohibited.
- 7. No student should try to enter or exit the bus until it has made a complete stop.
- 8. The front door of the bus is the only authorized entrance and exit.
- 9. Objects of any kind must not be thrown out of the bus.
- 10. Students will be held responsible for any damage to buses caused by negligence or vandalism.
- 11. The drivers are authorized to stop buses at the designated stops only, unless otherwise directed by the bus in charge. No diversion/extension will be entertained on the existing routes.
- 12. Any violation of traffic rules by the driver must be reported to the Transport In-charge immediately.
- 13. Buses should be opted for at the beginning of the session. school will not entertain requests for transport during the session.
- 14. Even if a child uses the route one way, full payment has to be made for both ways. Students wishing to discontinue the bus facility should inform the school office atleast a month in advance. In case bus facility is used for a day during a month, full month's charges have to be paid.
- 15. No withdrawal from the bus will be allowed during quarter IV.
- 16. If any parent, whose child is availing the school transport service, wishes to take their wards privately in his/her own transport on a particular day, he/she should contact the reception/application has to be sent.
- 17. Parents should not argue with the teachers present in the bus or the conductor/driver. In case of any problem, a written complaint may be made to the transport In-charge. Kindly contact the Administration office in case of any problem.
- 18. If the transport fee is not paid by the final date of fee payment then the child will not be allowed to use the facility.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLY

Their participation in various Inter house events help in nurturing their overall growth and also help in inculcating healthy competitive skills. Such a division is intended to inculcate and awaken in the child, a striving for excellence and to place this precious acquisition of his, at the service of the community and the nation.

SCHOOL RULES

Students of DPS should stand out as smart, confident, disciplined, cultured and well-spoken individuals. The school expects the students to imbibe discipline as a second nature.

The school follows certain norms rather rigidly in the best interest of learners.

- 1. Every student should carry his/her almanac to school each day.
- 2. They should wear their complete uniform & identity cards daily. They should take pride in wearing school uniform.
- 3. Parents are requested to avail school bus facilities for transport of their students/wards. Non bus commuters should arrive at school 5 minutes before the school start.
- 4. Ensure that your ward carries books according to the time table to avoid any extra load of books.
- 5. All students must respect/wish their teachers & elders.
- 6. Speak in English once they are in the school campus.
- 7. Coming late to the class especially after lunch break, games period or any other activity lesson, is not allowed.
- 8. Use of abusive and filthy language/Bullying in school will lead to the suspension of students.
- 9. Possessing books which may be classified as obscence OR misuse of internet in Computer Lab is completely prohibited.
- 10. Respect the school property. Students are expected to take proper care of the school property. They should not mishandle, damage or break expensive electronic gadgets like the computer and T.V. installed in the class rooms or any item or furniture or electronic fittings otherwise the students will have to pay the full cost of the concerned item along with a heavy fine.
- 11. Students should not write, scratch or engrave graffiti on desks, chairs and other surfaces. Those involved in such nefarious activities are liable to strict disciplinary action.
- 12. While moving in the corridors or using staircase students should walk in a queue and keep to their left. Running in the corridors, pushing other children etc. will not be tolerated. Changing of class rooms between periods should be done in silence and in an orderly manner.
- 13. It is compulsory for all the students to attend the Assembly. No student shall stay back in the class during Assembly without prior permission from the class Teacher/Principal.
- 14. Students are not allowed to bring sharp instruments like blades, knives etc. to school.
- 15. Irregular attendance, unjustified or unexplained absence from the school, habitual late coming, disobedience, showing disrespect to teachers and any other type of unruly and objectionable behavior are considered grave acts of indiscipline, which can lead to expulsion from the school.
- 16. Students must maintain the clean and green beautiful surroundings of the school campus and not deface it with candy wrappers, disposable tumblers, poly packs etc..



- 17. Non Sikh boys should get their hair cut at regular intervals.
- 18. Students are warned not to buy anything especially eatables from street vendors.
- 19. Don't misbehave while travelling in bus.
- 20. Girls should plait their hair if it is below the shoulders. Short hair should be neatly cut and pinned. Kindly note that streaking / highlights / fancy hairstyles are strictly not allowed.
- 21. As far as possible, once a child has come to school, he / she should not be asked to come home on half day leave or leave for any period, unless it is an emergency.
- 22. Students should get their Report Cards signed by their parents / guardians within five days of the receipt of the Report Cards and return them to the class teachers. If lost, a fine will be imposed.
- 23. The school reserves the right to terminate the schooling of students with unsatisfactory progress in studies of WHOSE CONDUCT IS A BAD PERCEPT FOR OTHER.
- 24. Don't indulge in rowdyism, cheating, rude behaviour and insubordination as it could lead to immediate suspension or expulsion from school.
- 25. Students are not allowed to wear Jewellery in school (no chains, rings, bangles, bracelets). Girls may wear one pair small earrings or studs only. Girls should not wear kajal or eyeliner.
- 26. Mobiles , smart watches etc, are strictly prohibited in school. They will be confiscated if a student carries it.

RECOMMENDATION TO GUARDIANS

RECOMMENDATION TO GUARDIANS Parent's Responsibility: Parents are required to cooperate with the school in developing their children into balanced, progressive, morally strong and disciplined youth, by helping their children to observe the general code of conduct in and outside the school.

- 1. Fill in the details in the almanac along with photographs and signature.
- 2. Ensure that ward wears the school I-card daily. The name and class of the pupil should be clearly marked on all belongings of the students for e.g. blazer, tie, pullover, skirt, trousers, socks, shoes etc.
- 3. Students should be habitually clean and always neatly dressed. The school uniform should be worn on all working days and for all school functions. Students who are not in proper uniform will not be allowed to enter their class rooms.
- 4. Ensure that your child is punctual and regular in attendance.
- 5. Inform the school office of any change in your address or telephone numbers or mode of transport.
- 6. Carry the access card whenever you need to visit the school (mandatory for every parent).
- 7. Follow a formal dress code while visiting school. Please refrain, particularly, from wearing shorts, bathroom slippers or night suits.
- 8. Do not accompany your ward to the classroom at the arrival time and by picking up your ward from the school gate only.
- 9. Insist the neatness and cleanliness in your child's personal appearance. They should also wear proper school uniform on all days.
- 10. Attends PTMs regularly and discuss, with the teacher, the growth and progress of our ward and also ensure that your ward attends PTMs, in school uniform.
- 11. Fill the leave record by submitting leave application to the class teacher on the same day or positively by the next day.
- 12. Do not permit your ward to bring his/her own vehicles.
- 13. Girl's hair must be either cut short or tied back neatly. Check the nails, haircut, uniform and punctuality of your ward in the morning.
- 14. Students are not allowed to wear jewellery to the school.
- 15. Check your ward's Almanac daily. Do sign the remarks, if any and take necessary action.
- 16. Ensure that your ward carries books according to the time table to avoid heavy bags.
- 17. Carrying excessive cash, cell phones or electronic devices is strictly prohibited. The school will not be responsible for goods, articles, money or books lost by children. Parents should not send expensive items with their children to school. Restrict daily pocket money to Rs. 50/- per day. Excessive spending should be discouraged.
- 18. It is always advisable to write to the school about any concerns of your ward. So that the school can support in a positive manner.

- 19. Kindly support your child in the preparation of school tests so that the child can perform in a satisfactory manner.
- 20. Encourage your ward to take a balanced interest in studies, co-curricular activities and sports.
- 21. Be polite and respectful towards the school staff and do not be loud with any one for any reason whatsoever.
- 22. Compulsorily avoid criticism of teachers and of the school, especially in the presence of your ward.
- 23. Parents are required to carry the Parents Identity Card whenever they come to school for attending the PTM's or functions, to buy uniform or books etc.
- 24. Do not question any remedial measures taken by the school authorities, towards improvement of your ward's behavior and performances.

Parents are required to cooperate with the school in developing their children into balanced, progressive, morally strong and disciplined youth, by helping their children to observe the general code of conduct in and outside the school. Misbehaviour in the school is dealt with by the Discipline Committee of the school. Recurrence of such acts may lead to expulsion of the defaulting student from the school. However, punishment is administered only with a view to correct the defiant behavior of the child. The Principal has the right to refuse continuation of studies to any pupil whose conduct is unsatisfactory.

Condition for expulsion:

- A. A student caught indulging in some highly undesirable activity will be expelled immediately from the school.
- B. A student who falls in a class for two successive years or fails twice in three years will be withdrawn by the parents at the end of the session.
- C. Any student caught cheating or using unfair means during the examination/test may not only be given zero in the subject concerned but an incident of this nature may lead to his / her expulsion from the school.
- D. In case a student stops attending school without any information to the school authorities, his/her name will be struck off the rolls, 15 days after he/she stops attending the school.

Students who habitually keep indulging in misbehavior despite repeated warnings and continuous efforts by school teacher to improve upon their behavior will not be enrolled/admitted in the school during the following academic session. A warning in this regard will be given to parents well in advance to seek admission in some other school.

Note-

- 1. If parents have any query, they can meet the teachers between 12:30 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. on Wednesday & Saturday with prior appointment. Though regularity in PTM is appreciated.
- 2. The school accepts no responsibility for any injury within the school premises. Only first aid shall be provided in such cases. All major expenses will be sole responsibility of the parent / guardian.

Scheme of Examinations and Evaluation

Tulips & Lilies (PRE - NURSERY, NURSERY, PREP) & PRIMARY WING

There is no formal examination system for these classes. A system of continuous evaluation is adopted. This approach of assessment encourages development of wider critical – thinking and self assessment skills. Students and teachers are actively engaged in dealing with the various nuances of the process of inquiry and the students are steered to assess their work at different stages and reflect to see if the aims and objectives set for learning have been fulfilled. There are two terms, the first term is April – Sept and the second term from Oct. – Mar of the subsequent year. Each term covers four reviews.

Assessment is done on the basis of Projects, Assignments, Quizzes, Research Work and Pen paper tests, etc to measure the effectiveness of learning.

- 1) For the holistic development of students, co-scholastic activities like Work Education (Thursday Activities) Art Education (Art/Dance/Music) and Health and Physical Education (Sports & Yoga) will be carried out and graded term wise on a 3 point grading scale.
- 2) The students will also be assessed for discipline, which will be based on attendance, sincerity, values, behavior, and tidiness, respectfulness for rules and regulations, attitude towards society, nation and others, on a 3 point grading scale.

Classes X & XII

- 1. 2 Periodic Tests of 30 marks each and 2 multiple assessments of 5 marks each will be conducted in the Academic Year for every subject.
- 2. Average of the 2 Periodic Tests and Multiple Assessments will be taken (reduced to 05 marks each to make a total of 10 marks) for the Final marks submission.
- 3. Syllabus for the Periodic Tests will be increased cumulatively.
- 4. Annual Exams (Class X) Board Exam (Class XII) will cover 100 % syllabus of each subject.
- 5. Different activities will be conducted in the entire year for Subject Enrichment Activity.

Co-Scholastic Area

- 1) Students will be graded for Art Education & Health and Physical Education (Work Experience subsumed) on a point scale (A-E).
- 2) Discipline will also be graded by the class teacher on a 5 Point scale (A-E).
- 3) Kindly note that there will be NO UPSCALING OF GRADES.

Students found using unfair means during any Periodic Test will be marked Zero in that subject and given Yellow card. No re-test will be held for such students. These students will not be eligible for any academic award or school appointment.

Note: Marks for the Periodic test must be entered in the almanac and duly signed by the subject teacher and counter signed by parents.

CRITERIA FOR SCHOLAR BADGES

Class: III, IV & V (On overall basis) **

- 'A+' grade in English, Hindi, Maths, Science and social Science.
- Minimum 95% attendance.

Class: VI to X (On overall basis) **

- 85% and above in scholastic areas viz. English, Hindi, Social Science, Maths, Science & 3rd language.
- 85% and above in the average of both the terms.
- Minimum 95% attendance.

Class: XI

- Minimum 75% marks in language and minimum 80% in any three subjects including optional subjects offered.
- 'A'/'B' grade in General Studies & Computer Science.
- Minimum 95% attendance.
- Minimum 80% in aggregate.
- ** Average of First & Second Term.

Academic

Scholar Badge: The scholar badge ceremony is one of the prestigious and time-tested traditions of all Delhi Public School HRIT Campus whereby all meritorious students are awarded scholar badges for achieving distinction in their final exam aggregate.

1). Rules for Badge Holders

Apart from being Punctual, Disciplined, Well Dressed, Regular to school, Obedient, Helpful and Honest, Scholar Badges would be awarded to only those who have participated in all school activities.

Scholar Tie (Blue): A scholar Tie shall be awarded to a student who earns the Scholar Badge for three consecutive years (Class III and above).

Merit Certificate

A merit Certificate shall be awarded to each student who:

- a) Attains 100% attendance.
- b) Excels in games and sports.
- c) Excels in co curricular/cultural activities.


